Snails are an important part of the Fraser Valley's biodiversity. Several native snails can be found here, but should not be confused with the invasive grovesnails that frequent our gardens. Join Trinity Western University's Associate Professor of Biology and Environmental Studies, Karen Steensma, for a fascinating evening talk about our local land snails, with a focus on the endangered Oregon Forestsnail.
